

IMMUNIZATION

Indiana law and ~~The~~ School Board requires that all students be properly immunized against whooping cough, poliomyelitis, measles, diphtheria, rubella (German measles), tetanus, mumps, hepatitis (A and B), meningitis, varicella, and other communicable diseases designated by the State Health Department.

The Superintendent shall require parents to furnish, no later than the first day of school after enrollment, a written statement of the child's immunization accompanied by a physician's certificate or other documentation.

Upon request and after production of written affirmation of intent to comply with Indiana law, the Superintendent may grant a waiver to sStudents whose parents do not provide the required documentation by the opening day of school. Those students may be admitted to school provided the documentation is received within twenty (20) days.

If students remain unimmunized after 20 school days, the Superintendent shall commence expulsion proceedings; ~~unless~~, the parents have filed a religious objection or submitted a physician's statement that the immunizations are contra-indicated.

Exemptions to the immunization requirements shall be granted only for medical, religious, or other reasons allowed by the State.
